Who we Seek

La Casa de Don Pedro seeks Senior Counselors who will support the Afterschool and Summer Enrichment Program by assisting with the day-to-day administration and operations of the Community Empowerment pillar. To be successful in this role, the Senior Counselor should be energetic and enjoy teaching and working with children. The Senior Counselor will serve as an integral member of the Community Empowerment team and will contribute to the overall efficiency of La Casa de Don Pedro by providing personalized and timely support.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Responsible for the supervision and safety of all children within the Afterschool/Summer Day Camp Enrichment Program.
- Plan and implement daily creative learning activities in afterschool classroom setting with 15 children ages 5 to 12 years old that are developmentally, linguistically, culturally, and ageappropriate for the children served.
- Responsible for ensuring that all activities are adhered to in accordance with the daily schedule.
- Assist with student pick-up from schools.
- Responsible for proper use and care of all equipment and/or facility.
- Maintain positive relationships with parents and other staff members.
- Responsible in taking and reporting attendance in their group.
- Responsible with data collection, data entry and timely submission of reports and programs evaluations.
- Attend all required trainings and workshops to include but not limited to 20 hours of professional development to comply with state childcare center.
- Administer and observe the organization's office operations, policies, and procedures.
- Other duties may be assigned to meet business needs.

Educational & Experience Requirements:

- Associates Degree in Education or related major in a 4-year school and experience working with youth.
- Strong Communication and organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently and in a team-oriented environment.
- Must complete and pass a fingerprint criminal background check and Child Abuse Record Information form as required by the State of NJ.

Physical Requirements:

- Required to walk and stand for long periods of time.
- Required to lift up to 30 pounds.
